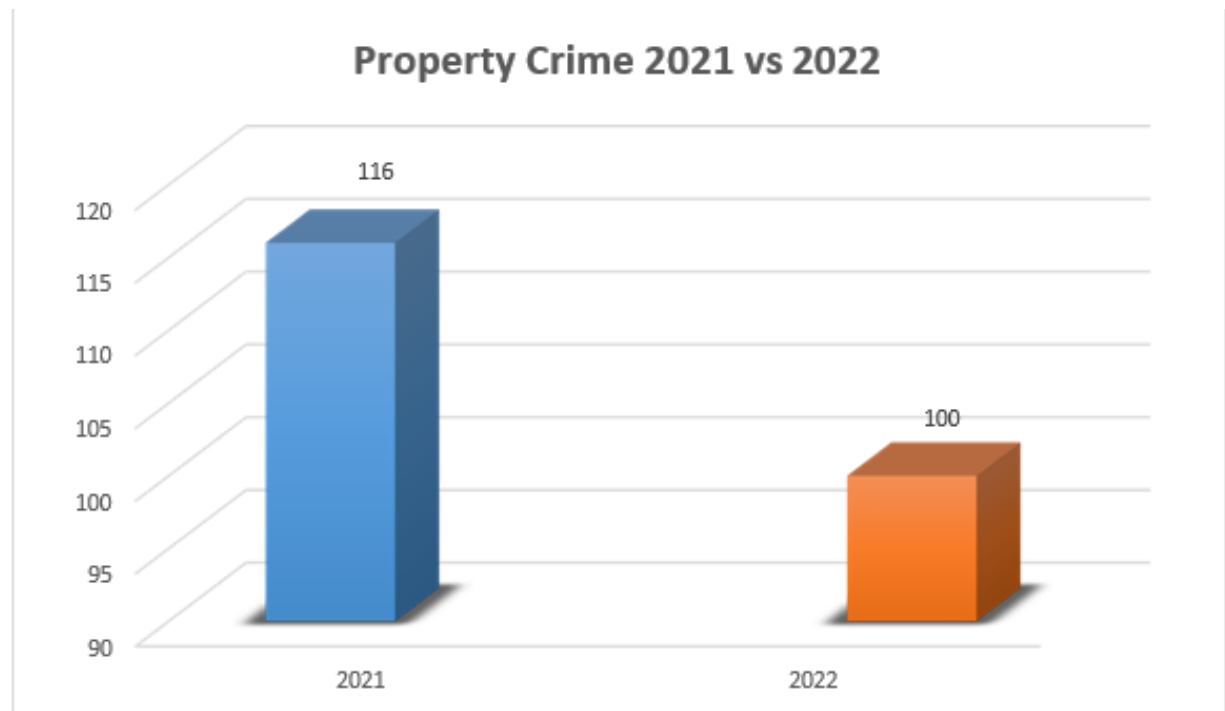

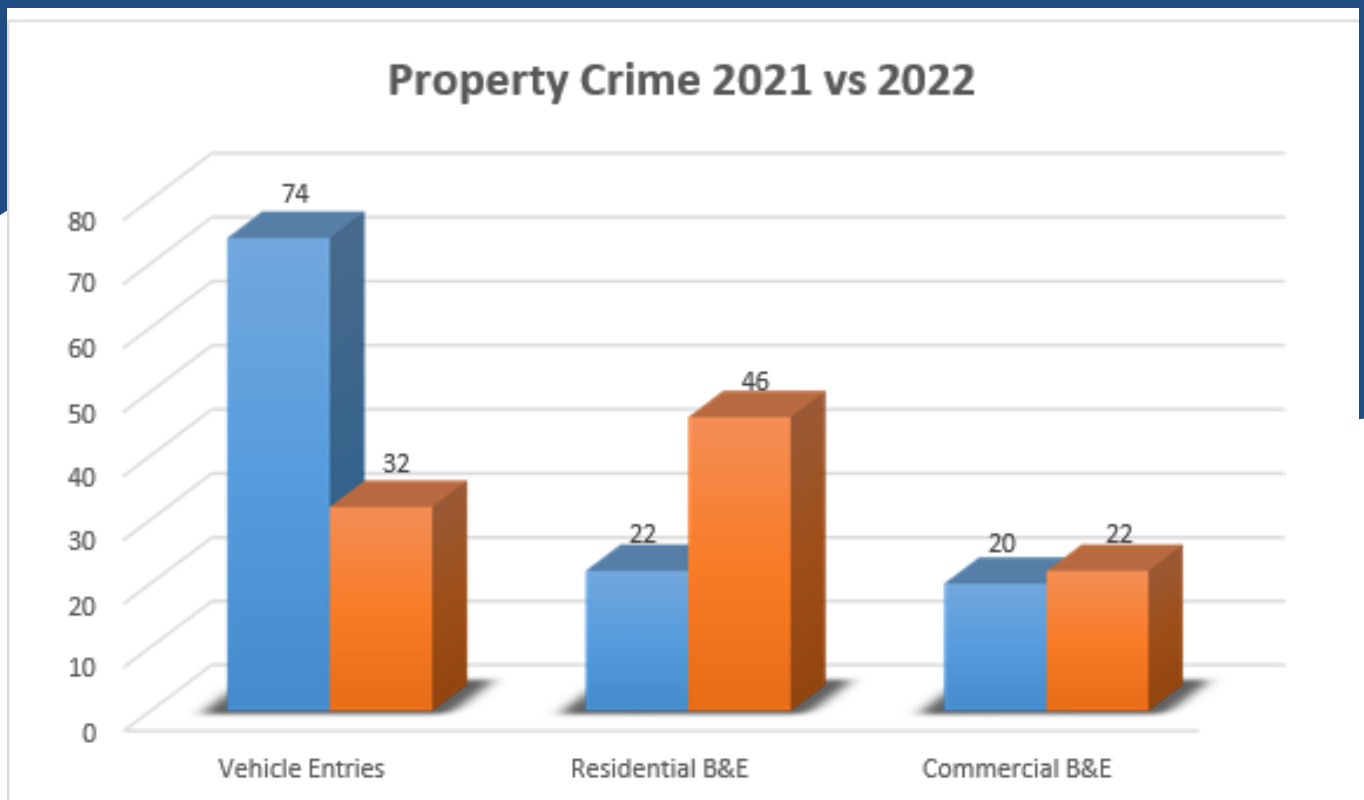
Number of Property Crime Related Incidents

Between Jan 1, 2022 and March 28, 2022, there were 100 property crime related incidents reported vs 116 during the same period last year.



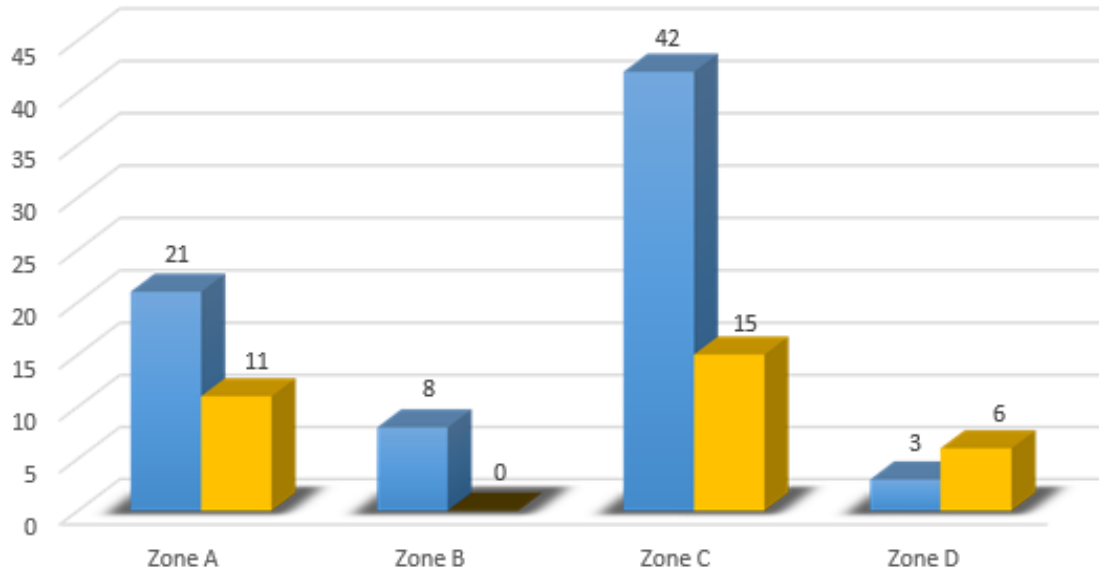
This is an overall decrease of 13.80% in property crime related incidents.

These are further broken down into three categories: Vehicle Entries, Residential B&E and Commercial B&E.



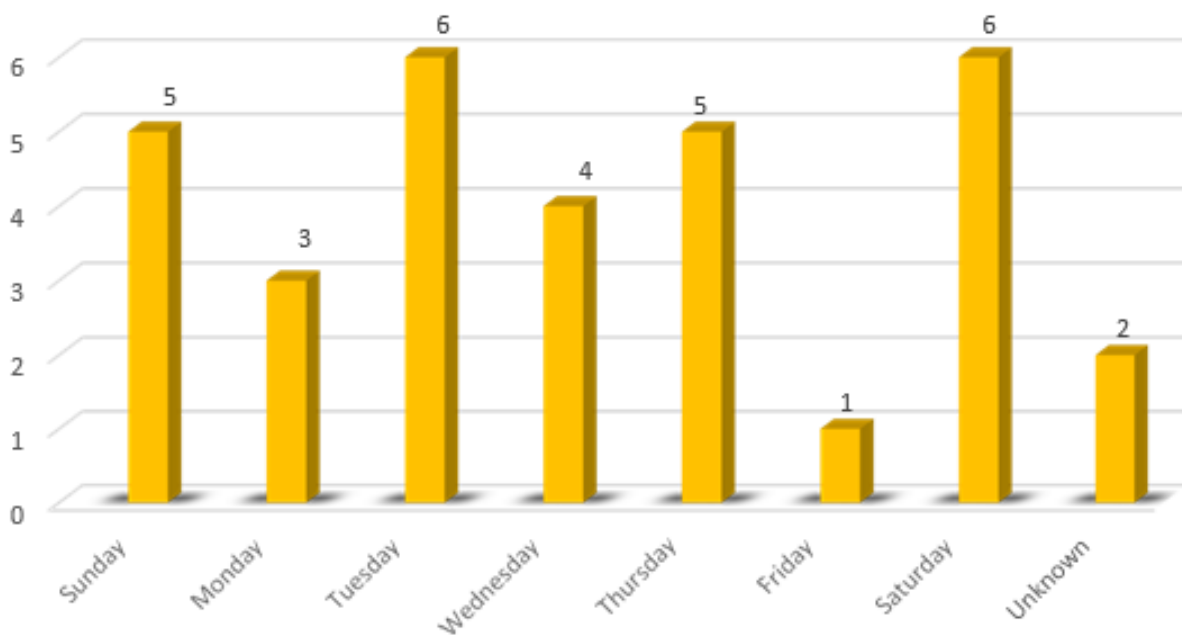
This indicates a decrease of 56.76% for vehicle entries, an increase of 109.10% for residential break and enters, and an increase of 10% for commercial break and enters.

Vehicle Entries by Zone 2021 vs 2022



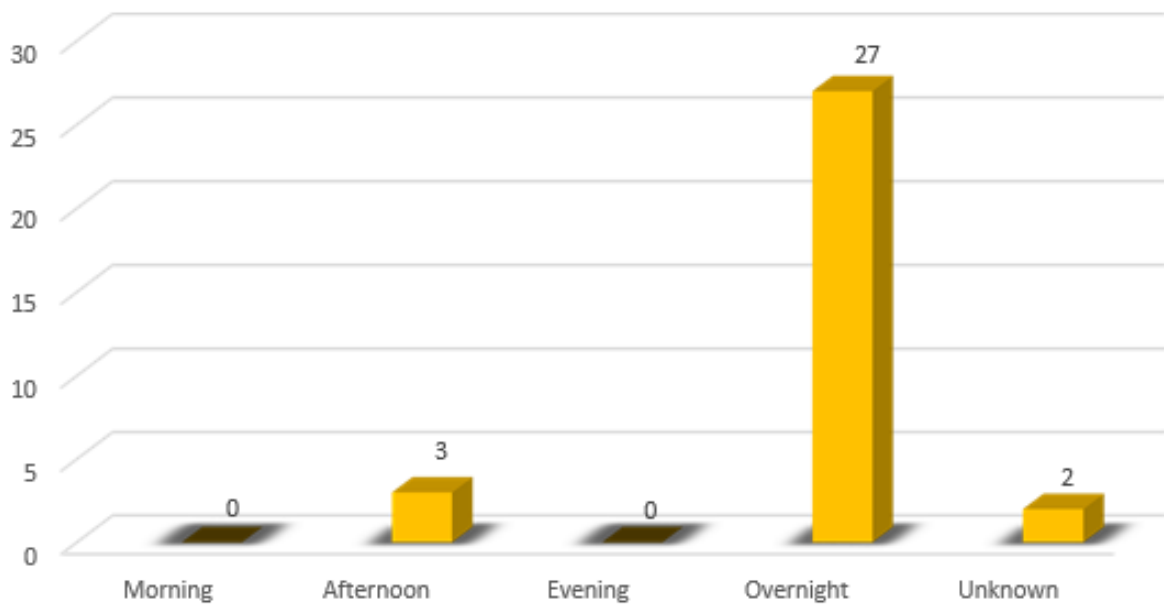
When looking at the reported vehicle entries by zone, the data indicates that in 2022, 46.88% of these incidents occurred in Zone C. This is a decrease of 64.29%. There was a decrease of 47.62% in occurrences in Zone A, 100% in Zone B, and an increase of 50% in Zone D.

Vehicle Entries by Day of Week 2022



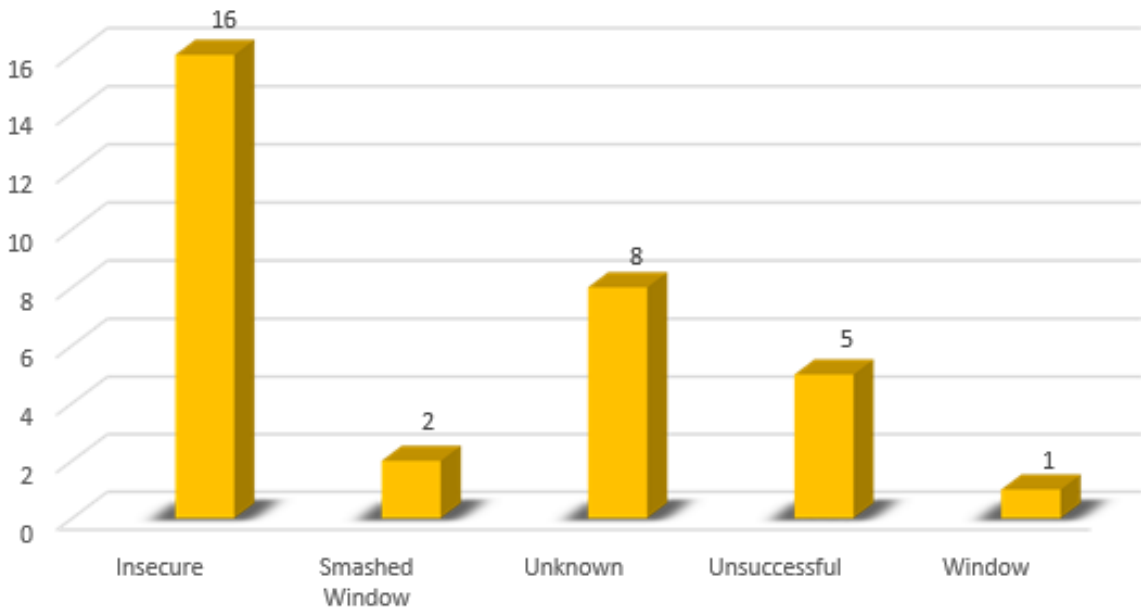
This chart shows that vehicle entries are spread out throughout the week.

Vehicle Entries by Timeframe 2022



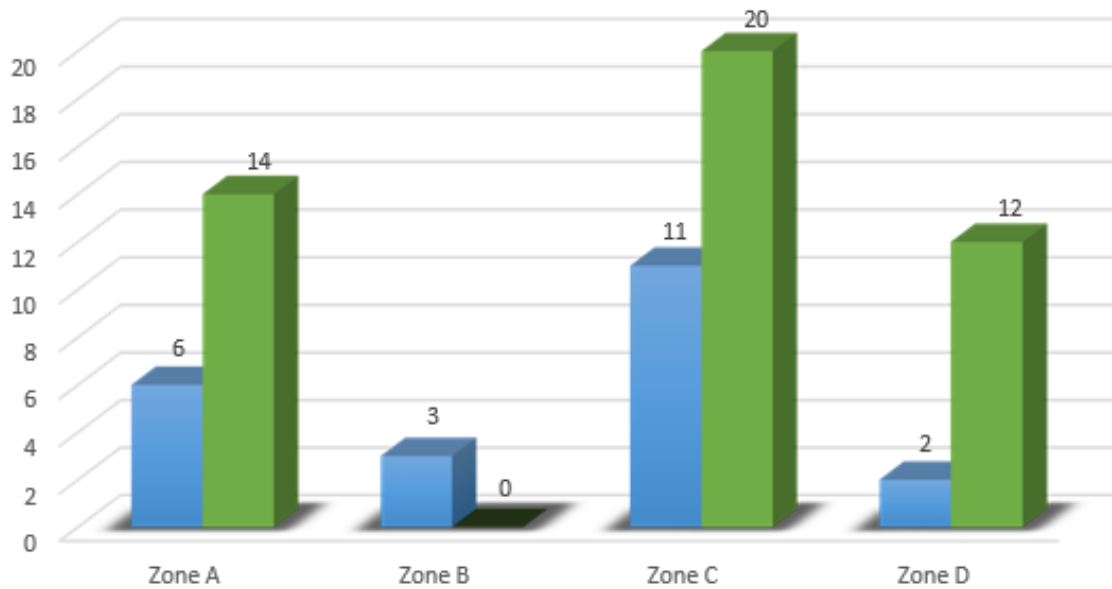
When looking at the time frame of the reported vehicle entries for 2022, we can see that 84.38% of the incidents occur in the Overnight timeframe.

Vehicle Entries - Method of Entry 2022



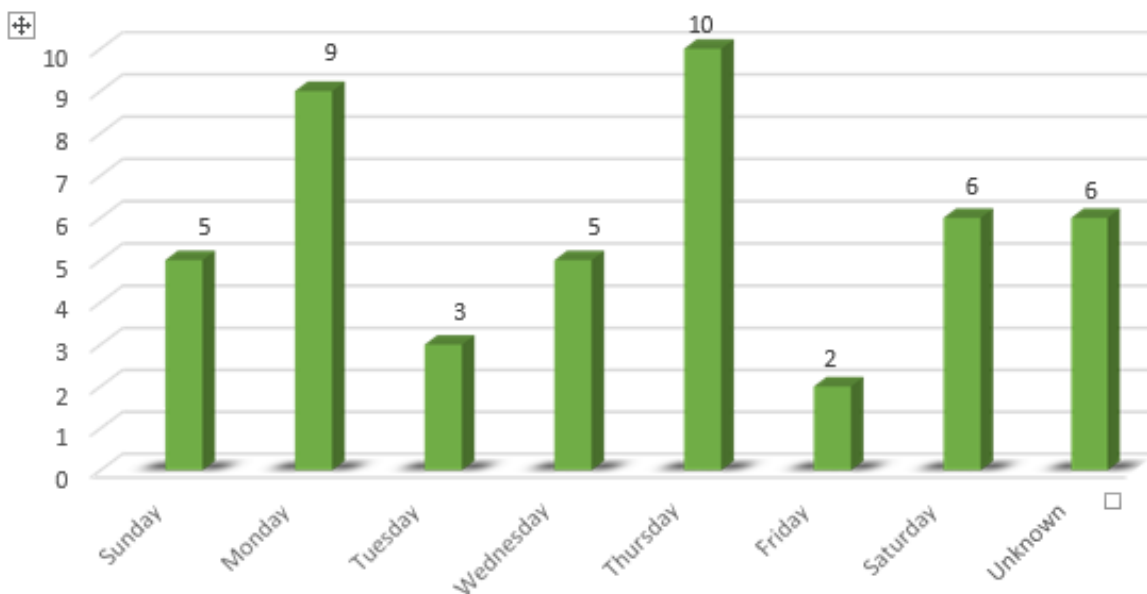
When looking at the method of entry of the reported vehicle entries for 2022, we can see that 50% of the occurrences were due to insecure vehicles.

Residential B&E by Zone 2021 vs 2022



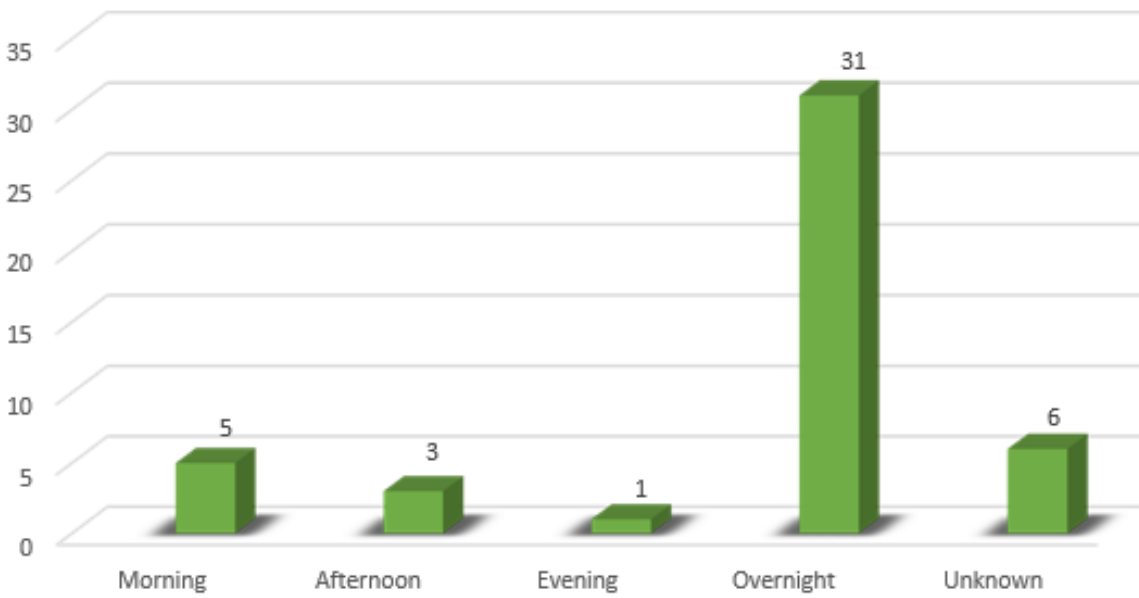
When looking at reported residential break and enters by zone, the data indicates that in 2022, 43.48% of these incidents occurred in Zone C. This is an increase of 81.81%. There was an increase of 133% in occurrences in Zone A, 500% in Zone D, and a decrease of 100% in Zone B.

Residential B&E by Day of Week 2022



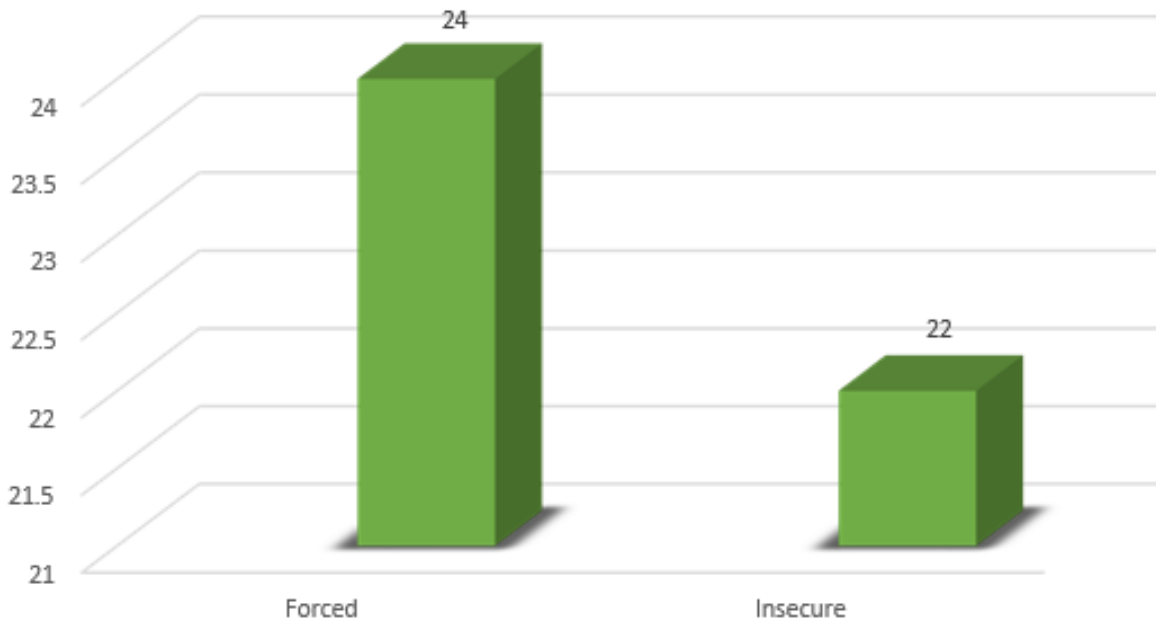
Looking at residential break and enters by day of the week, the data indicates that 19.57% occurred on Monday 21.74% occurred on Wednesday. The chart shows that residential break and enters are also spread out throughout the week.

Residential B&E by Timeframe 2022



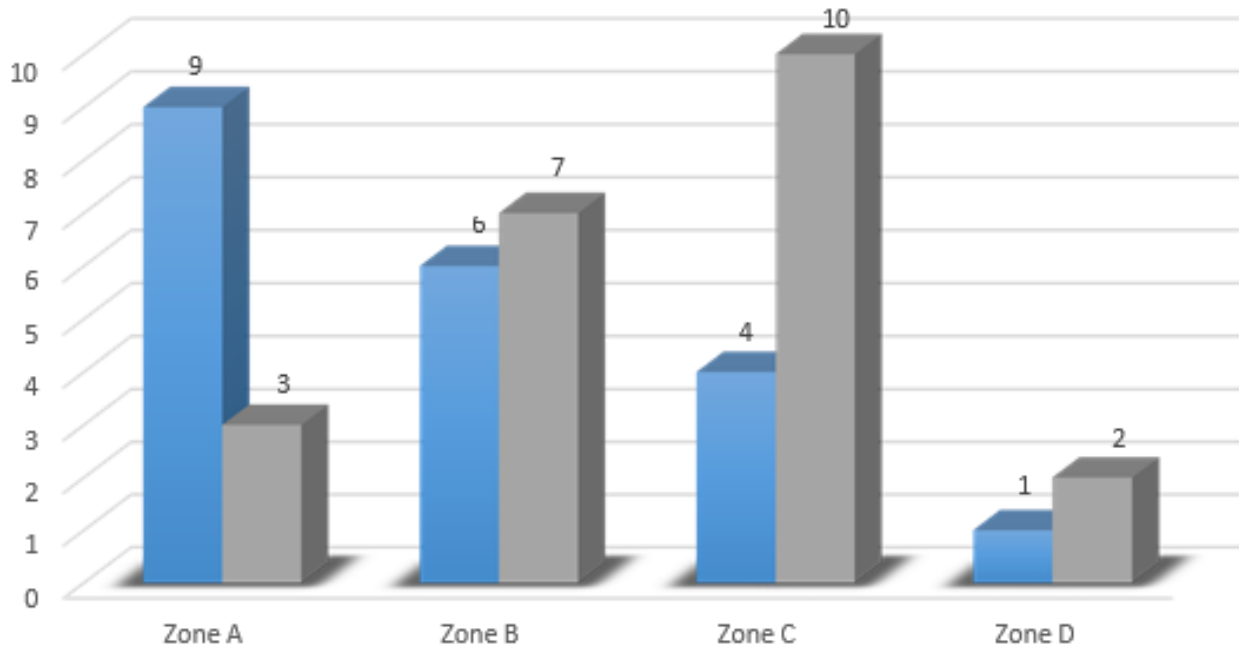
When looking at the time frame of the reported residential break and enters for 2022, we can see that 67.40% of the incidents occur in the Overnight time frame

Residential B&E - Method of Entry 2022



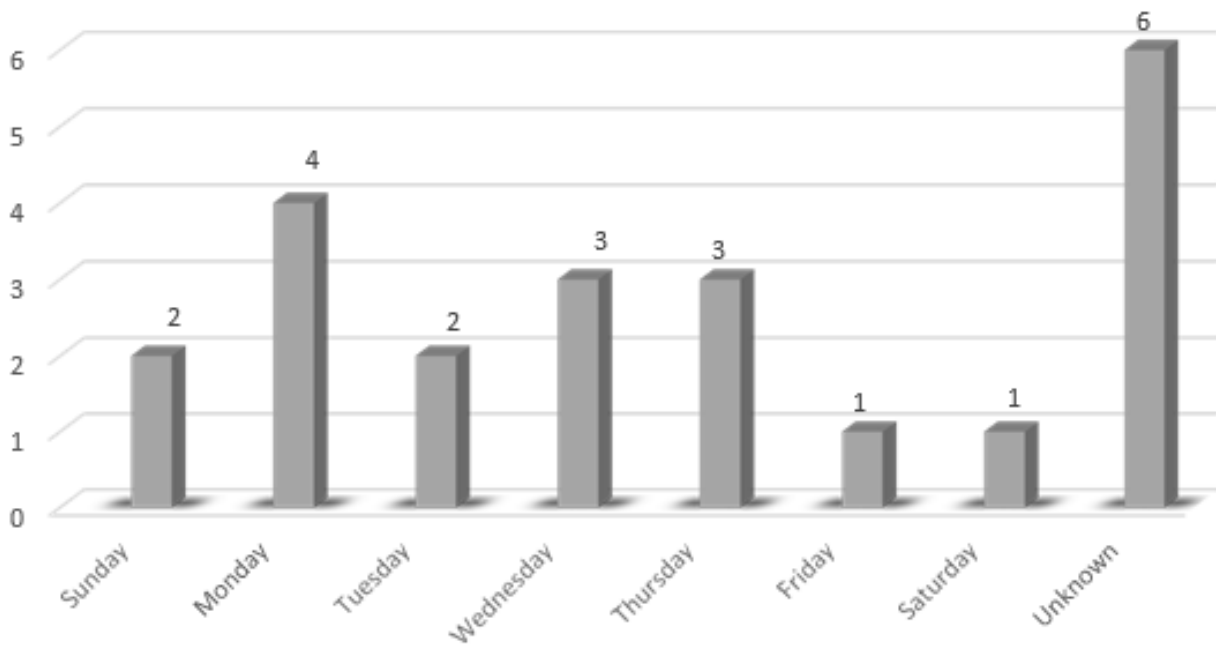
When looking at the method of entry of the reported residential break and enters for 2022, we can see that 47.83% of the occurrences were due to insecure points of entry.

Commercial B&E by Zone 2021 vs 2022



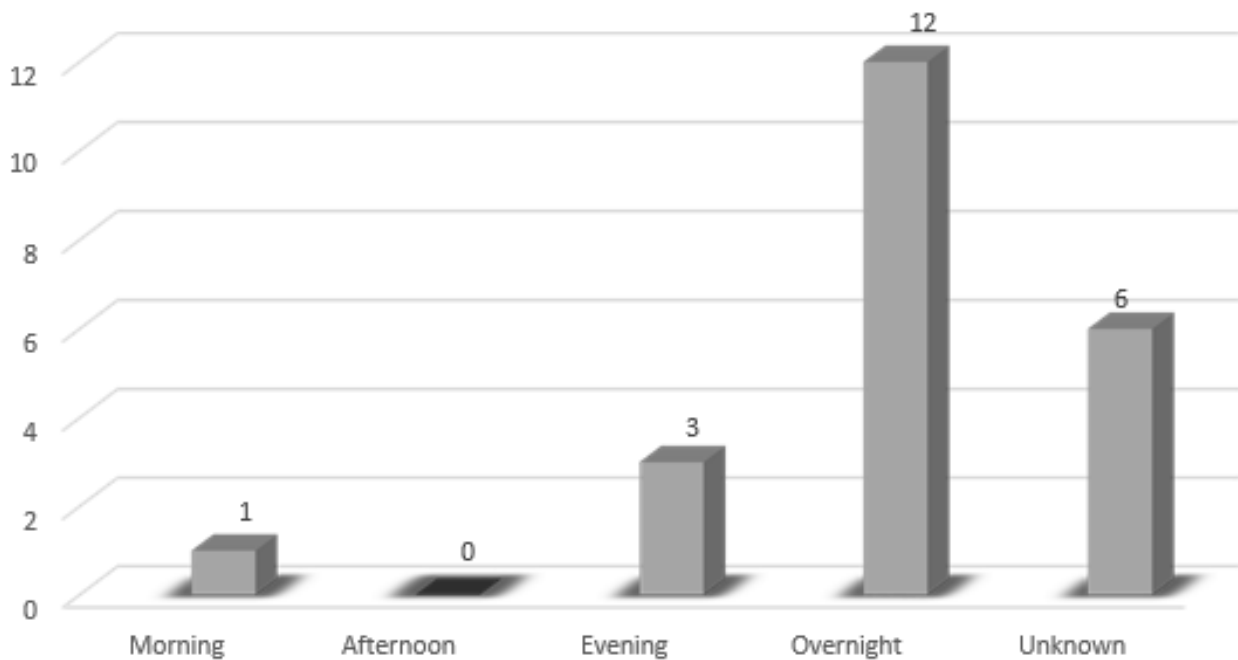
Looking at reported commercial break and enters by zone, the data indicates that in 2022, 45.45% occurred in Zone C. This is an increase of 150% for Zone C. Incidents in Zone A decreased by 55.55%.

Commercial B&E by Day of Week 2022



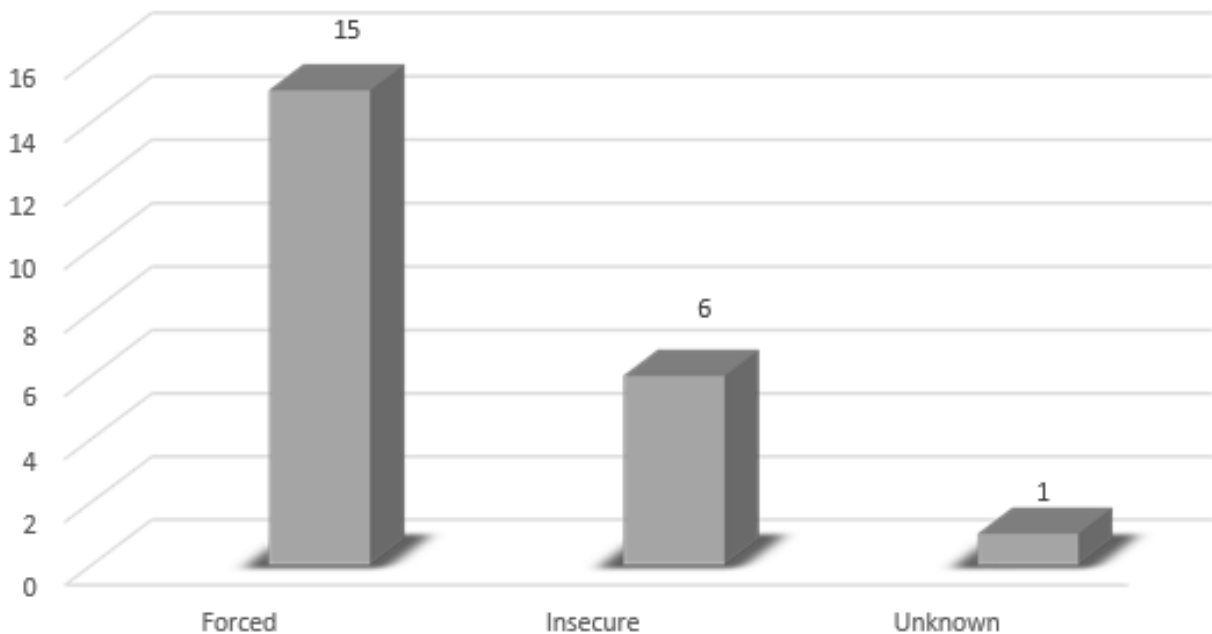
Once again, these occurrences are spread out throughout the week

Commercial B&E by Timeframe 2022



When looking at the time frame of the reported commercial break and enters for 2022, we can see that 54.55% of the incidents occur in the Overnight timeframe

Commercial B&E - Method of Entry 2022



When looking at the method of entry of the reported commercial break and enters for 2022, we can see that 27.27% of the occurrences were due to insecure points of entry.

Conclusion

The number of property crime related incidents between January 1, 2022 and March 28, 2022, has decreased by 13.80% overall compared to the same time last year.

Residential and commercial break and enters have seen large increases compared to last year, with 109.10% and 10.00% respectively. Vehicle entries have decreased by 56.76%.

Nearly half of the reported property crimes were due to insecure access points. This is a common trend and if more effort was put into securing these access points, property crime could be reduced by 44.00%.
