Public Mischief

A Thirty five year old St. Thomas man was arrested Wednesday night after he turned himself in at the Colin McGregor Justice Building. The man was wanted by police for Public Mischief after allegedly making a false report to police leading to an unnecessary investigation. The man had previously contacted police claiming his vehicle window had been smashed and several valuable items had been stolen while parked in the Walmart parking lot last week. Store security video did not support this claim and indicated a different version that was not reported

Mischief

A St. Thomas man was arrested early Thursday morning around 3 am after damaging an unmarked STPS vehicle. Officers on Community Patrol had parked the vehicle as they monitored an area behind Memorial Arena. As officers were patrolling the Whistle Stop Trail on foot when they observed a male jump on the hood of the vehicle, walk over the roof and off the trunk. The man was taken into custody without incident and transported to the Colin McGregor Justice Building for processing. Twenty eight year old Bryor Kiff was charged with one count Mischief to Property under \$5000 and one count Resist Arrest. He was later released on an Appearance Notice for court.

Sexual Assault

A fifty two year old St. Thomas man has been arrested and charged with sexual assault following an investigation by Detectives from the STPS Criminal Investigations Bureau. The man is alleged to have sexually assaulted a youth under the age of 16. Officers took the man into custody Saturday afternoon without incident and transported him to the Colin McGregor Justice Building for processing. He was charged with one count Sexual Assault on a Person under 16 Years of Age and one count Sexual Interference. He was later released on an Undertaking for court.

Internet Child Exploitation Unit

A twenty four year old St. Thomas man was arrested Friday afternoon by Detectives from the STPS Internet Child Exploitation Unit. The ICE unit began to investigate the man after receiving a tip from the RCMP-National Child Exploitation Crime Centre that images of child pornography had been downloaded to his IP address. Detectives confirmed the information and took the man into custody without incident. His electronic devices were seized for further search. The man was transported to the Colin McGregor Justice Building for processing where he was charged with one count Possession of Child Pornography and later released on an Undertaking with court date.

Man Charged in Revenge Porn Investigation

A thirty five year old St. Thomas man has been arrested and charged with Distributing Intimate Images without Consent. Detectives from the Criminal Investigations Bureau took the man into custody without incident Thursday evening. A search warrant was then executed at his residence. The man is alleged to have uploaded several intimate images of his estranged common law to several online adult oriented sites. He was transported to the Colin McGregor Justice Building for processing and later released on an Undertaking with court date.

Arrest Made in Vehicle Entry

A St. Thomas man was arrested early Tuesday morning around 3 am on Hincks Street. Officers on Community Patrol were driving down the street when they noticed the taillights of a truck were illuminated and the door was slightly ajar. The officer stopped to investigate and discovered a male in the vehicle with a pair of stolen sunglasses hidden in his jacket. Twenty nine year old Joshua Garrison was taken into custody without incident and transported to the Colin McGregor Justice Building for processing. He was charged with one count Theft Under \$5000 and four counts Breach of Release Conditions. He was held for a court appearance.



A nineteen-year-old St. Thomas male has been charged with stunt driving after being stopped for driving 118 km/hr in a posted 60 km/hr zone. STPS traffic specialist Officer Chad Nevill was monitoring road safety Wednesday afternoon on Highbury Avenue when he observed a vehicle heading towards South Edgeware Road at a high rate of speed. Radar registered the vehicle speed at 118 km/hr, which was 58 kms over the posted limit. The Driver was charged with Stunt Driving under the Highway Traffic Act and issued a summons to appear in court. The vehicle was seized for seven days and towed to a nearby compound.
